Let's Improve Well-Care Visits Together!

Child and Adolescent Well-Care Visits (WCV)

Measure Requirements:

Members who are 3 to 21 years of age in the measurement year and received at least one comprehensive well-care visit with a Primary Care Provider (PCP) or an OB/GYN provider in the measurement year. Four rates are reported:

- 3-11 years
- 12-17 years
- 18-21 years
- Total rate: 3-21 years

*Aetna Better Health®of West Virginia will pay for a well visit outside of the 12-month cycle.

$^{/f Q}$ Common Reasons for Gaps in Care:

- Adolescents may not routinely present to the PCP office unless seeking care for illness or injury.
- Missed opportunities remember that a well-care visit can be performed at the same time as a sick visit when clinically appropriate.
- Incomplete and/or inaccurate coding.
- Limited extended office hours or Transportation barriers
- FOHC/RHC if a T1015 on a claim does not also include the well-child codes that were performed.
- If ABHWV is the secondary insurance and we do not have a claim.
- Measures are captured via administrative methodology only - no chart review.

2025 Change:

Ås of 2025 telehealth visits are no longer eligible for compliance for the WCV measure.

Immunizations for Adolescents (IMA)

Measure Requirements:

Adolescents that turn 13 years of age in the measurement year and receive the following immunizations by their 13th birthday:

- 1 Meningococcal between 10th and 13th birthday.
 - ⇒ Meningococcal recombinant (serogroup B, MenB) is not compliant for HEDIS.
- 1 Tetanus, diphtheria toxoids and acellular pertussis (Tdap) on or between the 10th and 13th birthday.
 - \Rightarrow Td is not compliant for HEDIS
- At least 2 HPV vaccines on or between the 9th and 13th birthday.
 - ⇒ There must be at least 146 days between the first and second dose.
 - ⇒ Required for females AND males

Meningococcal: 90619, 90623, 90733, 90734

Tdap: 90715

HPV: 90649-90651

√o Common Reasons for Gaps in Care:

- Tdap, MCV and/or final dose of HPV given after age
- Incomplete HPV series.
- MCV given before age 10.
- Missed opportunities for immunizations when wellcare visits do not occur.
- Immunizations requirements for school attendance can be satisfied without meeting all HEDIS requirements.
- Immunizations given at other offices or health departments not billed or documented in medical record.

Best Practices

- Sick visits present an opportunity to complete a well visit, when clinically appropriate.
- Well-child visits that are performed at school-based clinics with any PCP may be counted if billed accordingly.
- Keep in mind that ABHWV will pay for a well visit outside of the 12month cycle.
- Schedule the next well visit at the end of each appointment.
- Discuss the importance of healthy behaviors, immunizations and the need for appropriate screenings.
- Consider member outreach via phone call, text, or email with appointment reminders.
- Help parents/caregivers/members understand the importance of going to the doctor for well-care, and not only when sick.
- Begin giving a strong recommendation for the HPV vaccine at age 9. Having the conversation earlier minimizes the discussion from sexuality/sexual activity.
- Recommend the HPV vaccine with the same confidence as other adolescent immunizations - a provider recommendation is the most significant factor when parents decide to vaccinate their
- Document all refusals (NOTE: this does not count towards HEDIS compliance, but it does prevent additional outreach to the office attempting to capture the immunization documentation).
- Code accurately—Be sure to code for specific vaccines given and not only for administration. Proper coding ensures compliance.
